Is there **any** milk?



Yes, there is.

Countable		Uncountable
Singular	Plural	Singular only
There's an egg.	There are some eggs.	There's some bread.
There isn't an egg.	There aren't any eggs.	There isn't any bread.
Is there an egg?	Are there any eggs?	Is there any bread?

Watch out!

Expressions like *a carton of*, *a bottle of*, and *a glass of* make uncountable nouns countable.

milk = uncountable

a carton of milk = countable
